

Cold Hardy Landscaping

Assess the Location

- 1. How much sun does the area receive?
- 2. What is the soil condition (sandy, clay, etc.)? Will it need amendment?
- 3. Which direction does the area face?

Plant Properly

- 1. Amend the soil if needed.
- 2. Never plant deeper than the existing soil level.
- 3. Use hardy plants that are right for the location.
- 4. Water well to establish a deep root system.

Plants for Sunny Areas

Loropetalum, Indian Hawthorn, Abelia, Dwarf Jasmine, Firepower Nandina, Knock Out[®] Roses, Drift[®] Roses, Hollies, Tea Olive, Banana Shrub, Mrs. Schiller's Delight, Texas Sage, Sunshine Ligustrum

Flowers

Blue My Mind[®], Gaillardia, Strawflower, Bulbine, Lily of the Nile, Mystic Spires, Bush Daisy

Palms

Pindo, European Fan, Windmill, Queen, Chinese Fan, Coontie, Palmetto, Pygmy Date

Plants for Shady Areas

Cast Iron Plant, Viburnum Suspensum, Hollies, Buttons Gardenia, Encore® Azaleas, Camellia, Nandina, Ferns, Purple Queen

Flowering Trees

Redbud, Purple-Leaf Plum, Tabebuia, Bottlebrush

Grasses

Muhly Grass, African Iris, Fountain Grass, Pampas Grass, Fakahatchee Grass
