Why Native Plants?

- Adapted to Florida weather: droughts, hurricanes, heat, cold, and high humidity.
- Adapted to poor Florida soil.
- Reduced need for fertilizer and other chemicals.
- Natural food sources for wildlife, birds, bees, and butterflies, and increased biodiversity.

- Increase mowing height of lawn to three inches
- Create pollinator habitats
